## Happenings at the Museum

People are always asking what's going on at the museum. Usually I'm too busy to remember it all, so I tried to make some notes that would help me get it together for this end of the year issue.

#### Eagle Scouts

An Eagle Scout (Dustin Rollings) project began our Reflection Garden that now contains the seven flags of the countries besides us who were involved in the Vietnam War. The museum volunteers and the Master Gardeners have added decorations to the original work. Now another scout (Andrew McNay) preparing for his Eagle Scout award has volunteered to add the bridge to the garden that was in the original master plan. Eventually, the Reflection Garden will encompass all of the green area west of the Meditation Garden. Perhaps another scout will show up to tackle the next phase. In addition to that project, we have a third scout who has volunteered to begin building our picnic area, west of the Visitor Center.

#### Semper Fi Garden

The Marine Corps League in Granbury has installed a beautiful flagpole in the Semper Fi Garden and work is in progress for a Marine Corps Emblem embedded in granite. Still too early to share exactly what that will look like, but the garden continues to grow.

It seems the USS Evans was on a mission, outside the official waters of the Vietnam War when a terrible accident resulted in the loss of 74 crewmembers. The ship started the mission in Vietnam waters and returned to Vietnam waters, but because the men were lost outside the official war zone, the names of those seamen are not permitted to be included on the Vietnam Memorial Wall.

J.C. and fellow shipmates are challenging that decision but rather than waiting they are placing memorials around the country in each state that was represented. The museum will receive a marker with the names of the Texans lost in that incident, and we have requested that we been considered for the larger marker that includes all 74 names. This memorial will be a great beginning for a garden at the museum dedicated to the Navy. We need a name for this garden and some Navy folks to help with design and construction.

They had a little help with the taking down and putting back up but they are back in place as off August 21.
