Galleries In the Museum Gallery #2

The picture on the back page shows the central exhibit of gallery number 2 "The Home Front." This exhibit is a replica of the Oval Office as it was during Lyndon Johnsons presidency. We know it is Johnson's office because of the three televisions located on the right side of the picture. President Johnson insisted on seeing **ALL** of the television networks simultaneously. The idea that there were only three major networks is a completely foreign concept today with hundreds of channels and more on the internet.

You will be able to sit at the President's desk and give orders to your staff (if you bring some staff with you). We also expect to make pens and paper available so that you can issue an executive order if you wish.

There were several presidents involved in the Vietnam War, beginning with President Eisenhower who was minimally involved, President Kennedy also had minimal influence, but Johnson who was promoted to president after the assassination of Kennedy took the brunt of the war. It was a primary cause of his leaving the presidency. Protesters still alive today will remember the chant: "Hey, hey, LBJ, how many kids did you kill today." Richard Nixon became president next and was responsible for bringing the North Vietnamese to the peace table. His tactic was simple; drop bombs on North Vietnam until they agreed to talk peace. Nixon left the presidency under a cloud of the Watergate scandal leaving the final decisions on the Vietnam War to Gerald Ford. Ford was president when North Vietnam invaded south Vietnam and congress failed to honor our pledge to support the south with supplies and equipment.

This gallery will cover the home front in great detail and may provide a changing story line due to the number of items involved in this part of the war. There were protestors, riots, killings (in the U.S.), returning veterans, returning POWs, families, and special stories on college campuses.

LONG RANGE EXHIBIT PLAN

Another exhibit in the Visitor Center that will require a lot of research is intended to be the story of the South Korean military in the war. The centerpiece of this exhibit is a zippo cigarette lighter donated to the museum by a Canadian man Dylan Solkaski. The lighter was a memento from Brig Gen Kim Yun Sang, CG 2nd Marine Bde Republic of Korea who gave those lighters to various people like we do today with challenge coins. The lighter is engraved with his name and his flag. The Koreans sent Army, Navy, Air Force and Marine personnel in excess of 300,000 to Vietnam. The Korean forces represented the second largest number of personnel involved in the war. You may recall that we helped the South Korean military defend their land against the North Koreans during the early 1950s. Apparently, the South Koreans believed in the cause of the Vietnam war. Please send along any artifacts that you might have relating to this story.

New Museum Facility Remember, this is not just a building, but a completed museum

When I talk to people about our fundraising for the new building, I frequently fail to mention that we are not talking about just a building.

The \$1 million dollar budget does build a complete building with 10,000 square feet on the ground floor, and 8,000 square feet on the second floor (elevator, bath rooms, etc.), but that's only the beginning. We also get the three galleries, Introduction, The Home Front, and Camp Wolters/Fort Wolters history. We also get the gift shop, and some full time staff.

This phase one plan also allows us the ability to expand up to 80,000 square feet of museum space if needed and as needed.
