Boats and More

The museum board has made many efforts to dispel the myth that the National Vietnam war Museum is a helicopter museum and/or an Army museum. Several years ago, we acquired an AMTRAC (amphibious track vehicle) used exclusively by the Marine Corps and the Marines helped us build the Semper Fi Garden. Just a couple years ago, we solicited some Navy folks from the USS Frank E. Evans Association to help us build a Navy Garden and we have been looking for an appropriate artifact ever since. This year we found several; two minesweepers, an Admirals Barge, and a Captains Gig similar to the one that was on board the USS Frank E. Evans. We'll be restoring that one first as it is already placed in the Navy Garden. One minesweeper will be available for sale and we will probably sell the Admirals Barge. The truck and trailer repositioned to place the Captains' Gig in the Navy Garden (shown below). Everyone not in the Navy or Coast Guard asks what is a Captains' Gig. The easy answer is that it is his floating staff car. It goes when and where the Captain wants it to go. Sometimes you are not near shore so can't get into a staff car and go anywhere. This will be our first restoration project. We are dedicating it to the USS Frank E. Evans and the 74 sailors lost during the Vietnam War.



Do you want to support the restoration of the Captains' Gig? Be the Captain for a donation of \$5,000. Be the OOD (Officer of the Deck) \$2,500, or Master Chief Petty Officer for \$1,000. Donors will be recognized with a permanent sign on the boat The picture at left shows the first two boats arriving at the museum; a minesweeper and a Captains' Gig. The truck driver and crane operator are shown coordinating the move. The minesweeper # 56 is the first one off shown in the picture below as the trailer has pulled out from under it.
